The incumbent performs a variety of routine work within established policies and procedures and receives detailed instructions on new projects and assignments.

Responsibilities/Duties

- Work with Adults, children, groups and families to help them deal with issues including but not limited to abuse, domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, neglect, poverty, trauma, social adjustment
- Provide social services to improve the social and emotional well-being of children and their families.
- Conduct initial assessments for clients and maintain accurate case records
- Collect relevant supplementary documentation and information to assist in determining case plans and coordination to appropriate TFS programs
- Works with resource coordinator along with outlined case plan program coordinators by meeting at intervals to follow up to monitor improvements in client's well being and efficacy of service providers
- Provide information and refer clients to resources for social, emotional and financial assistance as appropriate alongside resource coordinator
- Act as an advocate for the child/family in dealing with community resources, government agencies and during the decision-making process
- Other duties as assigned

Competencies

Must have ability to complete 40 hours of SART and 30 hours of CAC training within the first 60 days and pass a comprehensive background check

Experience Requirement

Minimum of a Bachelors degree in Social work or Psychology or a similar degree

*Social worker *may* be encouraged to gain license if a Masters in Social work as already been completed and work intermittently with behavioral health clinicians to later be able to take on clinical case load management
